

Dr. Angela White is the Director of the Teachers of Color (TOC-II) program and an Adjunct Professor of Special Education at Pace University. With a distinguished career spanning 42 years in P-12 education, she retired as the Superintendent of Schools at the Biondi Education Center @ Rising Ground, an NYSED-approved Special Education Program. Under her leadership, the center implemented a values-driven, student-centered, trauma-informed approach to service delivery, ensuring comprehensive support for students with disabilities from Pre-K through 12th grade.

Dr. White began her career as a Reading Specialist in the NYC Board of Education and went on to hold key leadership positions, including Director of Funded Programs, Assistant to the Superintendent, and Elementary Principal, all in service of students with disabilities. Prior to her tenure as Superintendent, she served as Principal of Brookside School and Assistant Superintendent of the Ossining Union Free School District.

Currently, Dr. White remains an active leader in the field as a Board member of NYCASE, where she co-chairs the Technology and Communications Committee. Throughout her career, she has been dedicated to ensuring equitable access to education for all students, with or without disabilities.
